






	<b>Golden Guernsey</b>	England	Study	Dairy	190-200	Docile, friendly	Excellent	Novice - Intermediate	Cool, Temperate	Produces up to 2,000 lbs per year; milk has high fat content; purebred animals difficult to attain
	<b>Myotonic/ Tennessee Fainting</b>	United States	Recovering	Meat	M: 175 F: 50-150	Docile	Excellent	Novice - Intermediate	Hot, Cold	Heavy muscling; parasite resistant
	<b>Oberhasli</b>	Switzerland	Recovering	Dairy	M: 125-150 F: 100-125	Docile	Excellent	Novice	Cool, Temperate	Up to 4,665 lbs milk/year (record); said to be less fearful of water and trail obstacles than other goats; does can be pushy with each other at times
	<b>San Clemente</b>	United States	Critical	Meat	M: 80-120 F: 50-80	Alert	Excellent	Novice - Intermediate	Warm, Cool	When sourcing, it is best to do it locally so they are adapted to local parasites
	<b>Spanish</b>	United States	Recovering	Meat, Some Dairy	M: 200 F: 50-125	Docile, active	Excellent	Novice	Warm, Cool	Meat; longevity; fertility; rugged adaptation
